To cope with the loss, Tomás kept a diary of his struggle in the hope of one day being able to give it to her. Simple and with austere beauty, this picturesque journey delivers a rare insight into Guatemalan culture on the big screen while delivering a heartwarming universal story.

In comes Elsa, a desperate woman whose son has recently been arrested. Elsa will grant Alicia an interview, only if she visits her son in jail. But when Alicia makes the visit, her world collapses.

In search of her lost youth, Karen rents a room in the centre of Bogotá and discovers her new-found freedom is sweet, but sometimes cruel.

Argentina | Julia Solomonoff | 2009 | 86min | Feature

This visually-stunning and beautifully-acted Argentinean drama is a tender portrayal of the unexpected revelations that affect two children as they begin the transition to adolescence. 'La Boyita', a little bubble-shaped caravan, has always been a place of refuge, games and confessions for Jorgelina and her older sister Luciana. As Luciana enters puberty she begins to seek privacy and independence from her adoring sibling. Rather than tag along after her sister at the beach, Jorgelina decides to spend her summer holidays with her father in the country. There she develops a close friendship with Mario, a local farm boy burdened by an important secret.

Venezuela | Marcel Rasqui | 2010 | 96min | Feature

Raised as brothers, Julio and Daniel have remained virtually inseparable ever since the newborn Daniel was found abandoned in a trash heap in their La Ceniza slum. Hope of a brighter future presents itself when a scout from the Caracas Football Club offers both boys a tryout with the pro team, just as a tragic act of violence results in creating a seemingly irreparable rift between them.

MACQUARIE UNIVERSITY 22 OCT

Latin America has long been struggling with human rights abuses arising from dictatorships, repression, civil wars and crime. In recent years it has been reported that despite democratisation, the region's respect for fundamental human rights is illusory. This event, held in collaboration with Macquarie University, will present a confronting new film release from Colombia together with a number of compelling short films. Following the film will be a topical discussion and live music by *Waldo Garrido* and *Navegaos*. Argentinean wine, Mexican beer, food tastings and more.

Impunity, What Kind Of War For Colombia ?

Colombia | Juan Jose Lozano | 2010 | 84min | Documentary

Colombia today: the biggest trial against Paramilitary armies - accused of killing thousands of Colombians - is designed to create "peace and justice". Instead the process comes to an abrupt halt, when the political and economic interests in the paramilitary war are uncovered. Are the victims' families doomed to stay victims forever or are they able to fight Impunity?

Navegaos is a Sydney-based band, they perform Latin American contemporary folk music. Modern instruments are blended with pre-Columbian sounds and Central American rhythms in a culturally rich and intense performance.

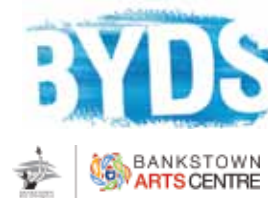
